

Northern Canada Mineral Exploration February 2021






Northern Canada Mineral Exploration (with Canada)



- Since 2007, NWT missed more than \$1.5 billion in exploration investment compared to Nunavut and Yukon
- All territories are now decreasing significantly, with Canada only moderately




NWT Exploration Share



The NWT is projected to continue capturing the same low share of Canadian exploration investment in 2021.




Nunavut Exploration Share





Nunavut's share of Canadian exploration investment has plummeted in recent years.


Nunavut & NWT Exploration Share

- Neither has investment like they once had




NWT – Senior vs Junior Exploration


Nunavut – Senior vs Junior Exploration


NWT Exploration vs Deposit Appraisal 2008-2021







Exploration Plus Deposit Appraisal Expenditures¹, by Province and Territory, by Mineral Commodity Sought, 2020. (current as of February 2021)






Total NWT Mineral Resource Development Investments
