
#### **Key Messages**

#### **Some Northern Facts**

- Area: 1/3 of Canada
- Arctic conditions & climate
- Canada's most under-mapped region
- Little infrastructure = high costs
- Population: Less than 75,000
- NU Demographic: 84% Inuit & young
- NWT: 51% Aboriginal
- Nunavut single settled land claim
- NWT 4 settled land claims, and several still to be settled
- Most heavily subsidized regions of Canada
- Non-renewable resources are our economic advantage and our future




Area of NWT + Nunavut = Norway, Sweden, Finland, Denmark, France, Germany, Poland, Spain, Portugal, Italy combined.





#### The North: a land of resource opportunity

- Tremendous mineral potential
  - Fraser Institute Survey ranked NWT & NU geology as 6th & 7th most attractive of 93 global jurisdictions
- 8 geological provinces
- Spells diverse mineralogy
  - Gold, silver, diamonds, lead, zinc, uranium, tungsten, rare earths, cobalt, bismuth, nickel, copper, iron, etc.
- Under-mapped & under-explored (equals opportunity)







# Mining has contributed to Infrastructure

- Highways, eg, to Yellowknife, Pine Point & Ft. Resolution
- Railway (to Hay River & Pine Point)
- All 3 NWT hydro-electric facilities
- Microwave communications
- Ports (at Nanisivik and Polaris)











**Current production from 5 mines**




- 3 diamond mines and a tungsten mine create huge value to the NWT

# Mining benefits – a community game changer

- From 1998 2010, diamond mines contributed:
  - More than 17,000 person years northern employment
    - Nearly 9,000 (more than 50%) Aboriginal
  - Over \$8.5 billion in northern business
    - Nearly \$4 billion is Aboriginal
- Nunavut's gold mine is creating similar local benefits
- Mining is the largest employer of Aboriginal people



# Mining is the largest private sector contributor


- NWT Mining's direct economic contribution exceeds all other private sectors
- And mining contributes to other sectors, eg, real estate, transportation and construction
- Nunavut's one mine is already contributing ~ 20% of GDP








# New mine benefits stack up

- Training & jobs
- Business expenditures
- Government benefits
  - Royalties, tax revenues, social assistance savings
- Aboriginal revenues
  - direct royalties
  - shared resource revenues









# Total opportunity value is significant

- Nunavut mines potentially 10 new mines
  - Capital investment over \$10b
  - Jobs at peak (overlap) over 7,000
  - Total person years employment nearly 100,000
  - Total life of project expenditures \$35b
- NWT mine potentially 6 new mines
  - Capital investment about \$2b
  - Jobs at peak about 1,650
  - Total person years employment about 25,000
  - Total life of project expenditures about \$12b







# **Providing investment certainty**

- Northern Regulatory Improvement Initiative
- In legislature today: Federal Bill C-47:
  - NWT Surface Rights Board Act
  - Nunavut Planning & Project Assessment Act
- In process: Amendments to NWT's Mackenzie Valley Resource Management Act, including:
  - 2-year timelines
  - Life of mine water licenses
  - Ministerial policy direction
  - Regulatory Boards' efficiency and capacity

#### **Providing Policy Certainty – Nunavut**

- 2007: Mineral Exploration & Mining Strategy
- 2012: Reinforced supportive Nunavut Uranium Policy
- Underway: NU Economic Development Policy
- Underway: Nunavut Land Use Plan (Poverty reduction)
- Devolution discussions are in early stage












# **Providing land claims certainty – Nunavut**

- Single land claim (1993)
  - Co-management of resource development
  - Impact benefit agreements
- Inuit mining policy
- Inuit have vested interests:
  - Direct royalties: Inuit own strategic title to 38,000 km² of high mineral potential lands
  - Royalty sharing from Crown Lands too
  - Exploration partnerships





#### **Providing land claims certainty – NWT**


- Land claims providing co-management of resources
- 4 settled land claims are providing
  - Impact benefit agreements
  - Surface and sub-surface land ownership
  - Land use planning 2 complete, 2 imminent
  - Resource royalty sharing
    - \$34m from diamonds to date
- ~4 more land claims negotiations underway











#### Adding more certainty - NWT

- Tli cho land claim region Kwe Beh Working Group
  - Single point of contact for minerals industry
- In process: Akaitcho-Mining Industry MOU
  - Creates new Akaitcho Mineral Industry Support Office
- In process: NWT Mineral Development Strategy
  - Will support sustainable mineral development in the NWT
  - Encourage your speedy input see Discussion Paper









# Adding landlord certainty – NWT

- Devolution in process for April 1, 2014
  - transfers mining, oil & gas and lands to NWT Government
  - provides local control over resource development
  - will further increase Aboriginal resource revenue sharing
  - NWT Government promises to be equal or better landlord
    - Yukon devolution in 2003 increased industry investment



#### Other investment enablers

- Project facilitation
  - CanNor & its Northern Project Management Office
- Building community employment & business capacity
  - CanNor, NWT Government, Nunavut Government
  - Territorial Mine Training Societies & partnerships
- Investing in Geoscience
  - NTGO, CNGO, GSC & newly funded programs
